Dear Siblings in Christ,

It feels cooler than it should this time of year: however, memory isn't always reliable, because as my Xcel Energy bill tells me, it's actually 2 degrees warmer this month on average than it was last year. Who knew?



Turns out, our memories are often a little fuzzy on these matters: we think it shouldn't snow in April...and then we look back and realize it often has snowed in April over the past decade. Us humans, at times, can be forgetful.

This is partially why we continue to tell the same stories on repeat: every 3 years, we hear the same stories of Jesus. We follow the "Revised Common Lectionary," along with many other mainline Protestant churches and the Catholic Church. And we remember together the reasons we follow Jesus.

It is for that reason that we have started new traditions--one of which is our annual Blessing of the Bicycles: a way for us to remind ourselves and others that wherever we go, God is with us.

In this season, though it is cold, we bring out our bicycles, our scooters, our walkers, our wheelchairs, and our strollers, so that we might get out in God's creation and enjoy the nature that surrounds us. So, coming up, we will be hosting a **Blessing of the Bicycles** (and whatever other wheels you'd like blessed). This year it will be taking place at the **New Brighton Lion's Park Playground Tuesday, May 9th from 5-6pm**. Remember to invite friends and neighbors to join us. In previous years, some people biked to the event, while others drove in and took their wheels out to be blessed.

Spring Means Warmth...and Non-Profit Luncheons

Our local Community Support Center (CSC), where the mission is to prevent homelessness, had a fundraiser luncheon on April 19. This non-profit at Silver Lake Road and 16th Street in New Brighton uses trained volunteers and 1 (ONE) paid employee to assist local residents in avoiding hardship. The most likely issue is eviction due to non-payment of rent. CSC is very successful in working with landlords to delay/extend rent payments while the resident obtains employment (or more hours of employment) or daycare. In fact, in 2022 fifty-two families were not evicted due to CSC assistance!



Neighbors Helping Neighbors

Two members of the Atonement Charitable Giving Team attended this luncheon, which was held at Messiah Lutheran Church. We saw video interviews with a number of people who had benefited from the advice of CSC volunteers. These videos made clear how families' lives are improved via the efforts of the CSC.

ELCA Launches Truth and Healing Movement Article credit: ELCA.org



The Rev. Elizabeth A. Eaton, presiding bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), has announced the launch of the ELCA's Truth and Healing Movement. The focus of the initiative is to increase the church's understanding of the impacts of colonization on Indigenous people in past generations and in the present.

"We must be in better, right, and healthy relationships with the Indigenous people of Turtle Island," said Eaton. "As we know, the truth and our knowing and embracing it, is the first step toward healing for all of us."

In 2016, the ELCA Churchwide Assembly adopted the Repudiation of the Doctrine of Discovery. Following this action, Eaton commissioned a task force to lead the work outlined in the repudiation. The task force also developed "A Declaration of the ELCA to American Indian and Alaska Native People," which confessed the church's complicity in the oppression and genocide of Indigenous people and recommitted the ELCA to the work of Repudiation.

The ELCA's Truth & Healing Movement will enlist and empower members to become involved in the areas of focus started by the task force: development of appropriate settler narrative from a Lutheran perspective; encouraging the ritual practice of land acknowledgement; understanding Lutheran participation in Indian Boarding Schools; and support for communities impacted by murdered and missing Indigenous women and girls. The movement will also offer ways to participate in the national Truth and Healing Movement.

Since the 1960s Lutherans have supported the American Indian Movement, working towards justice for and with Indigenous People. The ELCA's Truth & Healing Movement commits this church to building and strengthening right relationships with our Indigenous neighbors.

Fee: Vehicle Permits—Anoka County required—\$7/day or \$30/year per vehicle entrance. Tent campers no cost! If you want to bring an RV/Motorhome/Camper, please reserve your own site.

What: Come join in an all church camping trip. Play at the beach, enjoy the playground, bring/rent a canoe to use at the boat launch, go fishing or use the nearby hiking trails. Bring your bike if you want to ride the Anoka Bike Trails or your golf clubs to play at nearby Chominox Golf Course. Just come and hang out too if you want a low key relaxing time to sit and talk or read a book. Fun for everyone outdoors. Full schedule will be posted before the trip.


