Generosity, stewardship and being stewards...what are we talking about?

We toss around words like stewardship and generosity a lot around our church. Sometimes we complicate this even more with talking about "being a good steward of what we have" while still questioning "are we doing enough?" or "is it actually making a difference?". So what does all this actually mean?

Generosity: (noun) is the quality of being kind and generous as in "I was overwhelmed by the generosity of friends and neighbors"

Stewardship: (*noun*) is the responsible overseeing and protection of something considered worth caring for and preserving. And by extension, being stewards is the job of all of us who are part of this ongoing process.

I point this out, because it's easy to see things like our budget and come to the conclusion we have no money. I've even heard rumblings such as "why are we doing "this" [insert whatever "this" is] when it's obvious we can't afford it. Or even more troubling is when I hear of "why can't certain things happen like they used to?" And while some of these are all fair questions, sometimes we are missing the point of what we are called to do and what opportunities we have available to us.

You've heard me say in the past, that it takes a village to do the pieces that we do at our churches. This is not an understatement in the slightest. That village includes people who are generous of their time, generous of their talents, AND generous financially. It is a combination of all of these things that help us to succeed in our missions of supporting our community, supporting our members, and bringing what Jesus taught us of loving our neighbor to life in a very real way.

As stewards of this generosity, we are called to ensure that decisions are made that support our mission. And while, it may be hard to see the direct impact, the impact is very much there. We are becoming a parish that will embody what it means to be welcoming. Where ANYONE can come and feel safe to worship, welcomed by our church community, supported in ways that are challenging under normal circumstances. This is what church is all about. This is what we should be all about.

To do this, it takes resources. It takes commitment, generosity of our members, and a vision for where we should be, while being mindful of where we are.

In the coming month, you will be seeing our new generosity campaign kick off with pledge cards being distributed at both churches. This is the first step, and this new campaign is not a one-time event, but rather a year-long opportunity for us to look at generosity from a larger perspective. In the Spring, a Generosity Fair is being planned where we partner with various organizations to provide information on what is going on in our community, our impact as a parish, and even opportunities for looking at your personal giving or future planning. In the fall, we will be looking at time and talent which is another key element of generosity and stewardship.

For the pledge forms, I encourage you to give from what makes sense within your budget. I want to be clear on this message: **every gift and any amount being pledged is appreciated and so important to the work that we do!** With budgets for each church and for the parish having already been approved, these pledge cards will now be used going forward for us to plan where to make decisions on expenses and even look to additional income opportunities to support these budgets. THANK YOU for your financial support over this next year and by completing the pledge form. Every single dollar counts. Every single hour of time given counts. It takes a village.

An example of this important village is our partnership with Atonement thereby forming the Crossroads Parish. This unique melding of our two congregations allows us to further expand our mission and be good stewards of the resources from each church. It is simply amazing at all the good work we can do while working together. With this partnership we were able to call Pastor Cassie Nault and Deacon Brad Mills who without a doubt actively support our mission and community. We are able to utilize our staff in a way that helps support our budget and mission in the most efficient way possible by *sharing these resources*.

In closing, we continue to be truly blessed to be able to worship together and even more blessed to continue partnerships within our parish and within our community. What is even more exciting is the partnerships and opportunities yet to come that are on the horizon. There is amazing work being done and I am so honored to be your Council President.

Thank you for continuing on this journey with us. Thank you for your generous support financially, through your time and talents you are able to provide, and for continuing to keep our parish in your prayers as we move forward.

Lord God, We praise You and we thank You for Your tender, faithful Love. Everything we are and everything we have is Your gift. In the Name and Spirit of Jesus, we commit ourselves to be good stewards of the gifts entrusted to us, and to share our time, our talent, and our material gifts as an outward sign of the treasure we hold in Jesus. 
